**Reflection:** “*Peaceful coexistence*” Sermon Notes Luke 9:49-55 Micah 4:1-5

- Lessons in Christian fundamentalism and Peaceful coexistence – tolerance.
- We have **the whole truth**, our **way** is the only way - Vs. 49, Master we saw a man driving out demons in your name, and we told him to stop, because he doesn't belong to **our group**.

At present, there are over 2,400 different Christian faith groups. Most teach that their 'way' is the only way.

- Two ways of understanding “**diversity**”
  - if you take it as a **challenge**, a competition, then you will have to eliminate others, that is what happened in the medieval period disregarding other religions, cultures, philosophies etc, as pagans, uncivilized barbarians.

-If you take **diversity** as a rich component of the society, Christianity as well as other religions, philosophies and cultures will become a blessing.

There are many ways to understand God, but God has His own way to come into our hearts, No one or no church/religion has the whole monopoly of the truth of God.

- Among the greatest religious leaders none was as articulate on **coexistence** as John Wesley, "I have no more right," he said, to object to a person for holding a different opinion from mine.

When his nephew Samuel, son of his brother Charles, went to a Roman Catholic Church, John wrote to him, I don't care what church you go to as long as you believe in Jesus Christ. ..

*'Be true to your principles, .....use every ordinance which you believe is of God. Beware of narrowness of spirit, .....love as brothers and sisters those who cannot agree with you, .....agree with truth and reason. Condemn no one for not thinking as you think. Let everyone enjoy the full liberty of thought, abhor every approach, in any kind or degree, to the spirit of persecution. If you cannot reason or persuade a person into the truth, never attempt to force someone into it.'*

2. Since the hospitality of Jesus was refused by the Samaritans, the disciples wanted to take revenge, and wanted to destroy the villages. Hospitality and Peace vs violence – If they accept that's fine otherwise destroy them all.

There was a centuries old quarrel between Jews and Samaritans - John 4:9. Jesus taking that route to Jerusalem was unusual: and to find hospitality was still more unusual. Jesus was extending a hand of friendship to people who were enemies. In this case His hospitality and friendship were refused. Therefore, his disciples got mad and wanted to take revenge, destroy the villages.

- **The irrationality of ethic and religious hatred, intolerance and violence:**

The amount of religious and ethnic hatred and violence in the world is not only appalling, it is also difficult for many people to understand.

"A person born in Middle-east or Pakistan is very likely to be a Muslim, a one born in Thailand, Sri Lanka, Burma or Tibet is very likely to be a Buddhist, a one born in most parts of India is very likely to be a Hindu and one born in Britain, Europe or the U.S.A. is likely to be a Christian. In Africa it is a mixture of Christian and Muslims.

A question arises as to why anybody should become an enemy just because he or she professes a different religion? What is the root cause of intolerance?

### 3. What does it mean by Peaceful Coexistence Micah 4:1-5 Dream or vision of the Prophet?

There are many challenges to achieving reasonable levels of consensus and peaceful coexistence among human beings. As well as the lack of dialogue on more objective issues that pervade social life, there are **deadlocks, controversies, and disputes**, what can be said about clashes between diverse convictions and beliefs, often antagonistic about certain ethics, principles, and customs.

This scenario is further aggravated by the fact that the same right to freedom of religion of a given individual is used by him/her as a weapon against the identical right of the other and, in this conflict, one or both parties maintain that they hold the **absolute truth with them**.

Religious intolerance stems from the idea that I/we hold the absolute truth. And also, which refers to insecurity diminishing our faith, therefore we need to protect it.

**Finally**, let us turn to the Prophet Micah 4:1-5 Dream or vision of the Prophet?

- ❖ God will settle disputes among the nations...Vs 3
- ❖ Values of the Kingdom – people will turn killing machines or weapons into agricultural tools. Turn the minds of scientists to development rather than building nuclear weapons. Vs 3b
  
- ❖ No preparation for war...Vs 3c
- ❖ Everyone will sit under their own vine and under their own fig-tree, And no-one will make them afraid. Vs 4 means every one lives in peace....Peace is having his/her own income, living without fear.
- ❖ Each nation will have its own religion and God, but we will worship our God. Vs 5.
